Some good news – the spare keys and the KTM Owner's manual arrived today from Denver –




... so now I can find out how the thing works and I can do the important things like setting the correct time and adjusting the suspension.




I was directed up to the "fashion mall" where all the good eye doctors work (apparently) and managed to get some antibiotics for a small scratch on my eye.

Mileage - 296


Total – 1,190

But I found my motel:




and arrived safely

I met some local Harley riders, who were very friendly and they told me of their experiences of riding down the Baja. Which were all good.



But I eventually found a company that provides fully comprehensive cover and I also managed to get a good price for medical cover too, up to \$1,000,000 no less!
